#### 6. Photo-Taking for Primary 1 and 6 Students for School Smart Cards

The Ministry of Education will be conducting the yearly photo-taking exercise for all students in Primary 1 and Primary 6 for the issuance of the School Smart Card (SSC). While Primary 1 students will get their SSCs by end Mar 2021, the photo-images captured for Primary 6 students will be used for the printing of Secondary SSCs when they are promoted to Secondary One in 2022.

The photo-taking session is scheduled to be on **Thu, 28 Jan 2021** in the school. Students will need to be in their <u>school uniform</u> for the photo-taking session. (Note: If they have PE lessons on that day, they <u>DO NOT</u> need to put on their PE attire. Instead, students will wear their school uniform.)

#### 7. Individual Student Details Report

As part of our school's annual data verification exercise, we seek the assistance of all parents to verify the accuracy of the information printed on the Individual Student Details Report and provide us with the latest information so that the school can provide the necessary support for your child/ward when required. #### 8. School Name-Tags

#### 10. Digital Portals for Teaching and Learning

# 11. Gifted Education Programme (GEP) Identification Exercise 2021 for Primary 3 Students

The GEP Identification Exercise aims to identify suitable students with high intellectual potential. There is <u>no</u> need to prepare your child for this test as test-preparation activities could inflate students' scores and not reflect their actual potential. Students who are not ready to handle the intellectual rigour and demands of the programme will struggle with the enriched curriculum and not benefit fully from it. This would put undue stress on the students, and may even cause them to lose confidence and impact their self-esteem.

#### 12. Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) and Enrichment Activities (for Primary 1 to 6)

#### > Enrichment - For Primary 1 and Primary 2

As part of the school's Learning for Life Programme, SporTs, OutdooR, Programme and

Inculcation of Values Education (STRIVE) @ Northoaks, our Primary 1 and 2 students will get to experience an enriched sporting curriculum.

Please refer to the following for the details of the enriched sporting curriculum.

#### <u>Sports Education Programme for Primary 1 – Wushu-Silat Exposure</u>

The optional enrichment programme will start in Term 3 (after the June holidays) on Mondays from 2.45 p.m. to 4.15 p.m. A separate letter with more details will be issued at a later date.

#### Sports Education Programme for Primary 2 – Basic Inline Skating

The optional enrichment programme will start in Term 1 on Mondays from 2.45 p.m. to 4.15 p.m. The first session will start on 22 Feb 2021 for Primary 2A and 2C. A separate letter with more details will be issued at a later date.

#### Enrichment – For Primary 3

Our Primary 3 students will be rostered to go through the four aspects of co-curricular enrichment programmes in Sports (Frisbee and multi-sports), Performing Arts (Percussion and Fusion Dance), Visual Arts and Outdoor Education. The intention of such a programme is to allow students to experience the different domains of CCA and learn different skills and life skills. The experience that students glean from Primary 3 will allow them to make a more informed decision of their own CCA choice at Primary 4.

The Primary 3 Enrichment programmes will be carried out on Wednesdays from 2.45 p.m. to 4.15 p.m. A separate letter with more details will be issued at a later date.

#### CCA – For Primary 4 to Primary 6

The school strongly believes in providing every child with a positive and enriching school experience. All students are strongly encouraged to participate in CCA to enable them to experience a holistic education.

We would like to assure you that CCA will resume from **Wed**, **3 Feb 2021** with strict SMM in place and the teachers in-charge will adhere to the specific guidelines provided by the Ministry of Education when conducting the CCA. All P4 to P6 CCAs will be carried out on Wednesdays from 2.45 p.m. to 4.15 p.m.

The Primary 4 students will be issued with a CCA option form by the end of this week for them to indicate their choices. Our Primary 5 and Primary 6 students will receive a separate letter with details of the commencement dates for their CCA.

#### SAFETY AND SECURITY

#### 13. Health and Security Matters

#### Safe Management Measures (SMM)

We are grateful that you have worked hand in hand with us in the implementation of SMM last year and we will still need the collective effort of all parents and students this year to exercise social responsibility so that schools stay safe.

As we enter into Phase 3, we would like to assure you that our school will continue with the necessary SMM, such as temperature-taking, visual screening of students and reducing congestion where possible to ensure the well-being of all our students. In 2021, the temperatures of all our students will be taken at all the entrance points using a temperature scanner as they enter the school compound.

We continue to seek your assistance in partnering us in the following areas:

- If your child is feeling unwell (e.g. sore throat, fever or cough), please take your child/ward to see a doctor and do not let your child/ward come to school.
- If students display flu-like symptoms in school, we will require the assistance of parents to take them home and seek medical attention.
- If there are any adult-household members (18 years and above) unwell with flu-like symptoms, please inform the school and keep your child/ward at home. Do ensure that the unwell adult household member seeks medical treatment promptly.
- All individuals on Quarantine Order (QO) /Stay Home Notice (SHN) /Leave of Absence (LOA) /Approved Absence (AA) should not be in school.
- Students are required to don their masks in the school. Students are advised to bring along a Ziploc bag to keep their mask when required (e.g. when they are having their Physical Education lessons).
- Do also provide your child/ward a spare mask so that if his/her mask is damaged or soiled, they could replace it.

#### <u>Visitor Management</u>

All visitors and parents who wish to visit the school and meet any of our school staff will need to have their temperature taken and visually screened for fever and flu-like symptoms. Visitors will also need to complete a visitor registration form as well as log onto SafeEntry using a QR code. Those who are unwell, or are on QO/SHN/LOA or have an adult household member who is unwell with flu-like symptoms will not be allowed into the school.

The QR code for Northoaks Primary is displayed prominently at our school gate to allow parents to self check-in /out. SafeEntry will currently not apply to parents who drop-off their children in the morning during arrival time. As such, if you are accompanying your child on foot, please do <u>not</u> enter the school premise. If you are driving into the school compound to drop-off your child, please do <u>not</u> disembark from the vehicle. Parents who are fetching your child/ward at dismissal will also <u>not</u> be required to log onto SafeEntry.

#### School Dismissal

We seek the cooperation of all parents and guardians to adhere strictly to the safe distancing measures put in place by the school while waiting for your child/ward to be released and refrain from crowding around the pick-up point.

As we will need to dismiss students by the level during inclement weather, we seek your understanding that dismissal for your child/ward may be delayed on such days.

Your vigilance and cooperation are important in keeping our schools safe for all.

- > Your child may record homework or other information in the handbook.
- ➤ You and your child's/ward's teachers could write to one another through this handbook. Your child/ward should alert his/her teacher if there is a written message from you to the teacher.

#### Tip for parents:

Help your child develop good habits. Encourage your child/ward to refer to his/her Student Handbook daily to monitor his/her homework himself/herself or whether there is a message from his/her teacher. Teach your child to use the class timetable for packing of his/her schoolbag daily.

- However, if there are urgent matters related to student well-being and safety, do inform our office staff when you call so that we could get other relevant staff to attend to you first.

### Parents Gateway

For safety and security reasons, the school will not be able to allow your child/ward to participate in the out-of-school learning journey if consent has not been granted.
